

Mapserver for digital historical maps on Germany and Europe since c. 1400 ("living-tool" infrastructure, containing some 750 maps)



HGIS on the European State System (1825-2008)

- Generates GIS-based thematic maps and map series
- Supplies an interactive microinformation system on European states from 1825 to 2000 (perhaps on territorial developments from 1500 to 1800 as well)
- Supplies an interactive microinformation system - as well as maps - on <u>European historical</u> <u>statistics</u> from1825 to 2000
- May eventually develop into a full-fledged online-system in its own right (HGIS EuropeanStates)




ArcGIS 9.3 is used as the <u>principal software</u> Supplementary:

- ImageMapperN2, to generate HTML files
- Excel 2003 to generate attribute tables
- Themak2, a digital mapping program, has been used for basic digitization.
- Themak2-files have been converted into SHP-format using a related *Themap*-software package plus a conversion tool developed in connection with HGIS Germany.

The European State System: 1820 vs. 2007




Number of sovereign states in Europe, 1825-2008




Boundaries of a given year

















Military alliances and the division of Europe, 1975



European Members of NATO, 1949-2009















Inhabitants of select European countries, 1825 (in millions)

Production of Iron Ore, Pig Iron and Steel, 1900 (in 1000 metric tons)




